

Psalm 40 (41)

Leader: Lord, heal my soul, for I have sinned against you.

Left: Happy the man who considers the poor and the weak.

Right:

All:

Lord, heal my soul, for I have sinned against you.

Psalm 45 (46)

Leader: The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our stronghold.

Left: God is for us a refuge and strength,

a helper close at hand, in time of distress,

so we shall not fear though the earth should rock, though the mountains fall into the depths of the sea;

even though its waters rage and foam,

even though the mountains be shaken by its waves.
