### Liturgy of the Word: 29th November 2020

**Entrance Antiphon:** To you, I lift up my soul, O my God. In you, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame

**Fr Dominic writes:** *"Stay Awake! Be Ready! You Don't Know the Hour When the Lord is Coming!"*

Jesus says, "I am going to prepare a place for you, & after I have gone and prepared the place I shall return to take you with me, so that where I am you may be too." I was reminded of this very forcefully this week when I was called to bless a parishioner who had died very suddenly at home. All the family were there & in deep shock. As we said the prayers, I could sense a deep faith & a desire to make sense of the sudden passing. The Lord was waiting for one of his own.

Each Advent when I go into the school & talk about the period of preparation I am always amused when one or other child cannot restrain themselves & decides that Santa Claus is the real reason for the Season. But as adults do we really know that "Jesus is the reason for the Season". Very often we get caught up with the present buying & giving, the 'family gathering' & who goes where. This, of course, is much more difficult this year with the restrictions, the Tiers & the fear of infection & the very real danger of the vulnerable being exposed to infection or even death. This should be a time, not only, of personal preparation but also of our responsibility to the wider community. We must be ready to change, to become the adult Christians that we are. We are called to conversion & to be a real example to those in our family & in our wider community. In this crazy time it is easy to try & find ways around any restriction that may be imposed, sulk like children that we are being deprived of our chance to celebrate, but how many of us could live with ourselves if a vulnerable member of our family died because we wanted to party? This will be a different Advent, a different Christmas & we have a responsibility to try to make it as safe as possible as well as being as fruitful. We must stay awake, be aware of our duty to protect our poor and weak.

**Thank you to everyone who got in touch to commit to buying a present for prisoners children this year.** Due to the coronavirus, Pentonville prison only had a small list which we were able to fill using monetary donations that you had already sent. PACT, who work with Caritas & with whom we usually split the donations, have decided that this year they will just ask for book tokens instead. They would like you to buy a token to the value of £10 that can be sent in a Christmas Card to a Prisoner's child. Please can you get a national book token, not a token for a shop that sells books. **As we come out of Lockdown we are pleased to advise that Public Masses can resume but subject to the same restrictions as before,** namely you must follow the stringent guidelines, you must pre book your attendance, (if your name's not on the list, you're not coming in!) and face masks must be worn at all times, unless you are medically exempt. You may remember that we had a problem with people not booking & just turning up, please do book as we cannot exceed the limit of people allowed in the church under the regulations, no one wants to be the one to turn people away, which is also unfair on our dedicated Stewards. Weekday masses are less well attended and so you do not need to book. If you have problems, please call us & we can book from this end. Communion will be given at the end of Mass and in the hand only. All masses will continue to be at St Teresa's to allow everything to be Live Streamed. We have made some changes however; - **we will no longer have a Sunday Mid-day Mass - we will only have the 8.30am & 10am.** Also as we come out of lockdown, the Wednesday Morning Masses & Holy Hours will stop. **We are currently working on Christmas mass times and will communicate them to you next week.**



**School Reception Admissions for 2021/22 open 2/11/20 until 15/1/21 - signing of the Certificates of Catholic Practice (CCP).** Fr Dominic will be signing the certificates but you will not need to see him in person, please follow the following procedures: [Download](#) and print the Certificate of Catholic Practice from the website (look on Home page or News) Fill in the required information and then send the completed certificate to the Parish Office, with a copy of your child's baptismal certificate. . Once you have submitted the certificate and supporting documentation, please allow three days to turn it around then you can pick up from the Parish Office. **Fr Dominic may ask you to call in to see him if he doesn't recall your family from Mass attendance.**
