

Fr. Jude writes: THE SUFFERING GOD

God knows our sufferings (Exodus 3:7). This is the good news. When we encounter the divine presence and become aware of His active presence in our lives, and of the fact that God is aware of our sufferings, we can hold fast to Him through what I may call a Covenant of Anchor. Holding unto God by faith is the wisest thing to do. When one surrenders one's self to the AWARENESS of the saving presence of God in one's life (called WISDOM), one could afford to "suffer and smile" and as such fulfil one's destiny of going about "doing good" (Acts 10:38) and "bearing fruit" (John 15:16) without "grumbling" (1 Corinth 10:10). One would begin to experience the full import of Psalm 103 on a daily basis.

As we prepare for the challenges of the new week, may we be filled with the awareness of the loving presence in our lives, of God our saviour who delivers us from every evil, granting us peace in our days and freeing us from all useless fears and anxieties. Amen. May we, by His grace, carry our daily crosses with joyful hope and patience. Amen. As we wait for the coming of the Lord who is already at work in our lives, may we experience the constant joy of the Lord's presence in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.


