Fr. Jude Writes: TRINITARIAN HOPE

'More than that, we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.' (Romans 5:1-5) This beautiful passage from the Second Reading for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity is a powerful spiritual elixir for us especially in these times of unparalleled distress in the global village, where many have not come to the fact that we are merely pilgrims on a journey.

The need to rekindle once again, theological virtue of Hope, cannot therefore be overemphasized. As we celebrate God's presence in our lives today, let us equally celebrate our Divine Capacities to express our lives as authentic sons and daughters of a Trinitarian God, who has transmitted eternal life to us by our Baptism. May we therefore be filled with renewed vigor and lively hope, as we confront with confidence the challenges of the new week, as the Joy of God's awesome presence brings fresh graces, healing, breakthroughs and open doors in all ramifications through Christ our Lord. Amen.
