## Fr. Jude Writes: THE SIGN OF EMMANUEL IS THE ANSWER

Therefore, the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, a young woman shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanu-el. (Isaiah 7:14)

As I was reflecting on the Readings of the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent, especially the first, I remembered that I myself had asked for a sign. It is not bad to ask for a sign, otherwise the Prophet Isaiah would not have asked Ahaz to ask. But when we do so, it has to be "from the Lord". It is not the same as "curiously seeking for a sign" condemned by Jesus (Mt.12:39). When the process is initiated by the Spirit of God, and directed to His glory, and carried out in trust, it is a noble one.

At my First Profession in 1992, I had asked the Lord for a sign with respect to the commitment I was about to make: "whether it would be acceptable to him". On that morning, I received a "visible manifestation" with respect to "my question". I have from time to time received visible and clear signs in answer to my doubts, with regard to assignments given to me. These "assurances" fortify me very much for any assignment.

Beloved, we are all made in the image and likeness of God and we are all His children, drawing our very existence from him (Acts 17:28). There is nothing the Lord does, without first revealing through signs to his prophets (Amos 3:7). We are all Priestly, People, Kingly People, Holy People, chosen by God (1Peter 2:9). He wants his children to ask in faith (John 16:24) that their joy may be complete. That is why He came: to answer our questions and complete our joy (John 10:10).

Dear beloved, we are very fortunate indeed because even as the "least in the Kingdom of God, we are "Great and Graced" (Mt 11:11). The Lord Jesus Christ has been offered to us as the answer to all life's puzzles and questions. He is both the SIGN and ANSWER that encapsulates every other sign and answer.

As we get nearer to the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord, may we experience a renewed anointing unto a ceaseless awareness of the everyday signs of His love which accompanies us from moment to moment!
